Lesson #12: Jesus' Fulfillment of the Messianic Prophecies

Thursday, December 1, 2016

This is a very special lesson in prophecy because it deals specifically with Jesus' fulfillment of the Messianic Prophecies found in the Old Testament. In all of my studies associated with prophecy, this is my favorite because of the statistical impossibility that one man could fulfill even a small portion of all the prophecies fulfilled by Jesus. I will admit that I have never personally counted all of the prophecies fulfilled by Jesus, so I am relying on the work (and word) of others. There is no way we can explore all of the prophecies in this particular lesson; however, we will hit enough of the prophecies to make the point that Jesus was indeed the Messiah!

There have been described in the Old Testament 300 prophecies regarding the First Coming of the Messiah and 500 of the Second Coming. All of these prophecies were made hundreds of years (some thousands) before the birth of Jesus and He fulfilled them *to the letter*.¹ Consider the following points regarding the mathematical likelihood that one man could fulfill a given number of prophecies.

George Heron, a French mathematician, calculated that the odds of one man fulfilling only 40 prophecies are 1 in 10 to the power of 157 (i.e., 1×10^{157}). That is a 1 followed by 157 zeros. Compare this to the odds of winning a 6-digit lottery to be on the order of 14 followed by 6 zeros.² Another mathematician, Dr. Peter S. Ruckman, claims the odds of one person fulfilling only 60 of them by the only person who claimed to be the Son of God, who died on a "tree" on Calvary, and who rose the 3rd day are astronomical!... not just one in one trillion, but one out of ten to the 895th power (1×10^{895}); that is a one over a one followed by 895 zeros.




Figure 1: The Family Tree of Jesus according to Matthew 1:1-16 and Luke 3:23-28

One of the most compelling and astounding aspects of Jesus being the Messiah is His genealogy. See the artwork provided in **Figure 1** that shows the family tree, or "Genealogy of Jesus Christ". You will note that the lines of both Mary and Joseph are provided in Luke and Matthew, respectively. Since Luke was writing for a largely Gentile audience, he wanted to trace Jesus' physical descent (which had to be through Mary), showing that He was not only the son of David, but also son of Abraham (through whose descendants God promised to bless the nations), and son of Adam (which relates Jesus to the entire human race). Matthew, on the other hand, writing for primarily a Jewish readership, wanted to authenticate Jesus as the legal heir of the throne of David through Solomon, who was Joseph's ancestor. Since Jesus was Joseph's adopted son, Matthew traces the legal right to the throne through him.³

Here is another *very interesting* observation. In Jeremiah 22:30, the Lord curses the disobedient King Jeconiah (also called Coniah and Jehoiachin) by saying that **none of his descendants** would sit on David's throne. On the surface, this curse would seem to contradict God's covenant with David that one of his sons would rule forever (as the Messiah). Since Jeconiah is in the line of David through Solomon that goes down to Joseph, Jesus would have fallen under this curse if he had been the natural descendant of Joseph through Solomon (in fact, Jeconiah died in captivity in Babylon and none of his descendants ruled after him). However, Jesus was only the adopted son of Joseph, not his natural descendant. Thus, He was not under the curse, but was qualified to be heir to David's throne legally through Joseph back through Solomon. However, Jesus was David's natural descendant through Mary back through Nathan; more importantly, this was

achieved through the bloodline as Jesus was born of Mary. The bottom line is that when God makes a promise, He makes a promise! Even when man messes up, God finds a way for His will to be carried out.

The prophecies in the Old Testament were critically important to validate that Jesus was indeed the Messiah. At times it is hard for us to believe that the Jewish Leaders of Jesus' time who had spent so much time studying the Old Testament could not recognize that Jesus was indeed the promised Messiah. However, their blindness was a testimony to their own agenda, as we are all prone to do as humans. As Paul stated in Romans 11:11, it is for our benefit (as Gentiles) that the Jews rejected Jesus.

Spend a few minutes reviewing the prophecies presented in **Figure 2**. Note on the right hand side of the chart the Old Testament prophetic passage, while on the left hand side is the corresponding fulfillment as presented in the New Testament.

We are nearing the end of our Prophecy Series. I hope you have enjoyed this study and learned a few new things! All prophecy hinges on Jesus; both in terms of His First Coming and the Second Coming for which we are eagerly awaiting. The fact that God has allowed us through the study of His Word to get a small glimpse of His-story for mankind communicates the love He has for us and the plans He has for us, especially if we choose to submit our will to His!

EXAMPLE: *Did you know that Psalm 22, written by King David 1,000 year before the Messiah, actually predicted that Jesus' hands and feet would be pierced?*
